

Parish Mass Schedule revisions

We will begin our 3rd year as a united parish family on July 1, 2024. This weekend in our bulletin I would like to announce several revisions to both our Sunday and weekday Mass schedule.

Even before my arrival as pastor of our united parish, I received regular requests to re-instate a Sunday evening Mass. A number of years ago St. Athanasius did have a *Sunday* evening Mass which was discontinued. Saint Joan of Arc never had a *Sunday* evening Mass. Given the number and consistency of requests; the Parish Council and I have decided to reintroduce this as an *EXPERIMENTAL* option for our parishioners. The hope with this Mass is to increase the number of people who are able to attend Mass at our parish on the weekend. The main obstacle is Sunday morning sports for our young families. Therefore, the hope is to see an increase in our weekend attendance. Given the true shortage of priests – we are currently blessed with an associate pastor in the person of Fr. Paul, leadership will carefully monitor attendance to determine if other revisions may be necessary.

With the introduction of Family Faith Formation as a new program which replaces our Parish Religious Education Program – we will slightly modify the 10:15 a.m. Mass with a change to 10:30 a.m. This will assist the ministers and musicians who have to move between campus sites.

Effective June 9, 2024 – Sunday Mass will be offered:

1. Addition of a Sunday 4:30 p.m. Mass at our East Campus at Saint Athanasius Church.

2. The <u>Weekday Mass Schedule</u> is being revised to fit the realities of our need based upon the availability of clergy and the actual attendance number of people who attend which can be less than 10 individuals.

Effective June 3, 2024 one weekday Mass will be offered at 8:30 a.m.

- a. We will offer 1 daily Mass from Monday thru Thursday at 8:30 a.m.
- b. Monday and Wednesday Mass will be offered at Saint Athanasius Church.
- c. Tuesday and Thursday Mass will be offered at Saint Joan of Arc Church.
- d. Friday Communion Services will continue at both churches.
- e. During the school year our parish school Saint Athanasius will attend the Wednesday 8:30 a.m. weekday Mass.
- f. The Academy students will attend the Tuesday 8:30 a.m. weekday Mass.

It is the hope of our parish leadership that the modification and addition to our parish Mass schedule will provide the most opportunities for parishioners to worship God together.







FIRST READING

Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was lifechanging for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twentyfour years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity – despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible? This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The


Jn 15:26-27; 16:12-15

Today we have a sequence before the Gospel. Today's sequence is well known and nicknamed 'the Golden Sequence." It is only one of four medieval sequences preserved by the Council of Trent (1545-63). A Sequence is a piece of liturgical poetry which expands on and explains the meaning of the celebration. "Veni, Sancte Spiritus" is commonly regarded as one of the greatest masterpieces of sacred Latin poetry ever written.

Next week is Trinity Sunday. The organ prelude shall begin 10 minutes before the Mass. It is the famous Piece d'orgueby J.S. Bach. Bach depicts the Holy Trinity in a triptych of sound! Come and enjoy music written especially for this day.



Arc of Hope is a nonprofit organization created to support St. Joan of Arc School, located in a small village in Uganda. The school was the dream of an inspirational leader, Fr. Simon Peter Kyambadde, a native of Uganda who earned his doctorate from Mundelein Seminary near Chicago. The school opened in 2008 with 267 students. Today it has grown to serve 822 students, providing opportunities for day and boarding students in preschool through 7th grade.

Arc of Hope supports the school in three key areas: Underwriting salaries, providing scholarships for high school and college students, and funding capital improvements on the campus.


"Building a Bridge" Book Discussion & Reflection with Mr. John Kyler and Mr. Collin McShane
