

#### **GOSPEL**

Mt 16:13-20

Jesus went into the region of Caesarea Philippi and he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter said in reply, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Then he strictly ordered his disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.

## **NICENE CREED**







For our position on the Right to Life, we begin with the principle that life begins with conception. Section 2270 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us: "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception."

Moreover, the protection of infants in the womb is further supported by the fact that they quickly have human gualities. Early in pregnancy a child has limbs, eyes, and a functioning heart. While it is true that the infant in the womb is not yet self-sufficient, the same could be said of the child recently delivered. Newborn infants are far from self-reliant. The fact is that an image done not far into pregnancy shows a child yet to be born, but with human attributes. And, children are often born prematurely and still do well.

In discussions of these matters we sometimes hear and see ambiguous wording. Terms are used such as "no mandatory motherhood", "lawful termination" and "reproductive healthcare". The choice of such phrases probably shows us that some who are discussing these issues do not want to make too clear what they actually stand for. Our mission, on the other hand, does not need such ambivalent phrases. We strive for the protection of the right to life of every unborn child.

Today's prelude is comprised of selected movements from Haydn's music for musical clocks. Musical/mechanical clocks contain a chiming mechanism and a small pipe organ. The organ pipes are operated by a spiked cylinder much like a music box. Composers such as Haydn and Mozart wrote for this instrument.

The joyful mood of the offertory music and the majestic character of today's postlude is a musical commentary on today's Gospel wherein Jesus tells Peter, "...You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church..." Many choral composers set this phrase from today's Gospel with much pomp and majesty. Being that our parish choir is on summer recess, the organ takes on the role of conveying this joy and majesty.

And speaking of choir... consider joining the parish choir. The singers are a really fun group of people who enjoy praising God in the Liturgy. More about the choir season soon!


